

# *Proclamation*

Hanama`ulu is located approximately two miles east of Līhu`e and is one of seven ancient land divisions (ahupua`a) on the beautiful island of Kaua`i.

In 1877, Hanama`ulu Mill, the Līhu`e plantation's second mill, was built and soon became known as the best financed and most modern plantation in Hawai`i, putting Hanama`ulu on the map.

In the 1950s, the Līhu`e plantation phased out the old camps and opened housing subdivisions at Hanama`ulu, enabling plantation workers and their families to own their homes.



This two-day event features cultural music and dances, arts and crafts, displays, ethnic foods, games and competitive activities.
